Vestry Candidates

The vestry is the council of St Peter's. In addition to transacting the temporal business of the church, the vestry works with the Rector, under the Bishop, to lead the congregation in the ministries of the church. Following the model of servant leadership, each member of the vestry is responsible for the effectiveness of our ministries, shaping and guiding them for the growth of the people of the congregation, and for our mission to the community beyond our walls. Members of the vestry are also committed to personal growth as leaders and to ministering to one another in Christian community.

According to the Canons, a vestry member must be a “communicant in good standing” (DoVCanon 11, Sect. 4) defined as:

“All communicants of this Church who for the previous year have been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and have been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God, are to be considered communicants in good standing.”
(GC Title I, Canon 17, Sect 3)

Members who have pledged for 2010 or who were givers of record in 2009 or 2010 are eligible to vote and will be voting for 4 candidates.

The Annual Meeting will be your one opportunity to vote.
